This month, I want to feature IPA and Hall of Fame member Jimmy Weber, who is originally from Pennsylvania. Western Jimmy's interest in polkas began the first time Jim-Fiedor's went to Grove in Mount Pleasant,

Learning clari- Fame voting categories. net, trumpet, concertina, and bass as his polka career progressed, he has been a member of many bands such as the Trel Tones, Joe Fiedor and the Polish All-stars, The Dynasticks, The Brass Connection, Polka Family, and The Knewz. Finally, in 1977, Jimmy formed The Sounds, one of the most popular bands then and now. Don't tell me you don't sing "Those Pennsylvania Hills are calling me home..." while traveling through western Pennsylvania.

That band separated in 1981 due to family commit-

ments. In 1985, Jimmy and the Sounds picked up where the original band left off. From 1985 through 1990, the band grew in nominations. Again, in late 1990,

In 2003, at the request of all of their polka fans, Jimmy reorganized The Sounds. He produced The Sounds Alive Again 2003 Reunion Tour, which included all of the major festivals and events throughout the country. During that year, The Sounds once again demonstrated their polka talents. Despite not being on the stage for thirteen years, Polka fans got more "Pounds of Sounds" for their polka dollars.

The Sounds overall recorded nine albums, winning many awards from the IPA and USPA, plus receiving 2 Grammy award nominations. Jimmy has written dozens of songs and arranged many old standards to have a modern flair. His most popular arrangement was "Up In The Attic" polka medleys, which paid tribute to bands past and present that impacted polka music and polka musicians.

Jimmy's IPA contributions and accomplishments include being inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2006, serving as Co-Master of Ceremonies at the IPA Hall of Fame and Music Awards Banquets, and serving on the Hall of Fame and Music Awards Committees for the past five years. He was the driving force behind introducing modern technology, ed playing the sax at age twelve in 1970, and at Election Buddy software, for the annual Hall of




