The IPA received a grant from the City of Chicago, thanks to the hard work of Chris Bogdon and myself, along with Randy Koslosky and Dan Mateia.







Cheesecake

Crust

1 stick butter or margarine

1 cup flour

2 tbs. Sugar

Mix like for pie crust, pat into flat 9x13 cake pan. Prick with fork. Bake at 375 for 20 minutes and let cool.

Filling

3-8 oz. cream cheese

3/4 cup sugar

4 eggs

1 ½ tsp. vanilla

Allow cream cheese to soften a little and mix with all the rest of the ingredients. Pour over the crust and bake at 375 for 20 minutes and allow to cool.

Top

1- pint sour cream

½ cup sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

Whisk together all the ingredients and pour over middle layer. Bake at 425 for 8 minutes and let cool. Refrigerate at least overnight or for up to 2 days before serving.





IPA President appoints two new Trustees, Kevin Adams and Kenny Olowin

Currently, there are 13 IPA[®] Trustees, each of whom also perform as an elector. Each trustee oversees 14 other electors creating an Academy of Electors of 195 regular members plus any Emeritus Trustee voters. Retiring trustees in good standing be granted emeritus status by the committee in order to maintain their voting privileges. Each trustee represents a geographic area, with the exception of one Trustee At-Large who oversees electors chosen from anywhere across the country.

With recommendations from the committee, the IPA President appoints each IPA trustee who is expected to serve a six-year term. Electors are appointed by trustees for three-year terms. Trustees in good standing serve up to two terms, with any additional terms approved by the committee. Similarly, electors serve up to three terms with additional terms requiring committee approval. The master list of electors is not to be published or shared with the general public. Beginning November 1, 2014, all trustees and electors must be able to communicate via email and access the Internet in order to perform their duties. The primary duty of all electors is to vote in the annual IPA Polka Hall of Fame and Music Awards balloting. Failure to do so result in their trustee replacing them with an-

other elector. All committee members and trustees ultimately serve at the pleasure of the IPA President. (for more information visit ipapolkas.com/ipa-hall-of-fame-and-awards-committee)

At this time, I'd like to recognize and thank Larry Walk, who has served for an amazing six full terms (36 years). As with another legendary trustee, Dick Pillar, I am bestowing Larry with the honor of Trustee Emeritus status.

To replace the late Fred Bulinski, and to fill Fred's At-Large trustee position, I appointed one of his talented electors, IPA Polka Hall of Fame[®] member, Kevin Adams.

I'm very grateful that Kevin and Kenny have accepted their appointments and look forward to working with them.
