He started his first polka band, "Bob Hoffman Trio" when he was a teenager and enjoyed performing throughout New Jersey.

In 1967 Bob was transferred to Illinois where he met his sweetheart, Dee. They got married in 1968 and had two children (Bobby and Michelle). They relocated to Florida in 1974, and Bob once again started a trio in the 80's playing local clubs. He took a break from playing while his children were young, but then began again after they were grown. He shared his love for Polka music performing at nursing homes for 15 years, while Dee danced and did sing-a-longs with the residents.

Bob and Dee were avid polka dancers best known for their many varieties of color-coordinated dress shirts, and always being the first dancers on the floor and the last dancers off the floor. They proudly attended every dance and festival possible and supported EVERY polka band at numerous clubs throughout Florida. Their loyalty and devotion to Polka music was commendable. Eddie Blazonczyk Sr. even referred to them as the "Polka Spark Plugs!'

It was an honor knowing Bob and having him as part of our 'Polka Family'. He will especially be remembered every year on September 18th, as he shares the same birthday as my wife.

What a year it has been.

2024 brought unprecedented challenges, but also many blessings. *Top of the list is you*— a friend of the Polish American Society! We are grateful for the kind words of encouragement, the many volunteers who helped dry thing out after our flood, and the urgent, generous response of nearly 90 donors to our Restoration Fund. Our spirits are lifted and we now see a path forward for the club!

"In the middle of difficulty lies opportunity." Albert Einstein's wise words point to the revival we envision for 2025. We continue to work with contractors, now having signed contracts for roofing and flooring work. We can't promise a specific date yet, but feel confident that the club will reopen later this winter, better than ever. We appreciate everyone's understanding and patience.

Prior to the two hurricanes that so damaged the club, it was a banner year. Hosting live bands with dancing most Sundays Nov-April; several special events including Dyngus and Paczki Day celebrations; a monthly contra dance and dozens of neighborhood Thirsty Thursdays. Also notable is that our community raised \$14,275 to send to local relief organizations supporting Ukrainian refugees, many of whom landed in Poland.

There were good times with friends, memorable stories shared at the bar, upbeat music and dancing, great Polish dinners, and plenty of community spirit.

Yes, we still have much work to do to get the club back in shape. And many board members and others continue to remediate serious damage to their own homes. But in this moment, we are pausing to say "thank you!" to so many of you who have had our back!



Just in time for Super Bowl Sunday..... Pizza Dip

- •8 oz. cream cheese, at room temperature
- •1/2 cup sour cream
- •1 clove garlic, grated
- •3/4 tsp. dried oregano
- Pinch of red pepper flakes
- •Kosher salt
- •6 oz. mozzarella cheese, coarsely grated, divided
- •1/2 cup grated Parmesan, divided
- •1 1/4 cups pizza or marinara sauce
- •2 oz. mini pepperoni slices
- •1 baquette, warmed and sliced



Step 2 -Transfer mixture to shallow 1-qt baking dish. Top with pizza sauce; sprinkle with remaining mozzarella and Parmesan, then pepperoni. Bake until bubbling and cheese begins to brown, about 15 minutes, broiling 1 to 2 minutes if needed. Let rest 5 minutes before serving. Serve with baguette slices for dipping.

Dip Tip - Want to give each person their own? Divide mixture in step 2 among eight 4-oz ramekins, then place on a rimmed baking sheet for easier handling. Bake until bubbling, 12 to 15 min.
