



#### Recipes from ... JPA Members

#### **Raspberry Lemonade**

- 2 cups fresh lemon juice (from about 15 lemons)
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 10-ounce bag frozen raspberries

\*\*Vodka to taste



#### Directions

1. Put the lemon juice in a pitcher. Mix the sugar and 1 1/2 cups water to make a syrup, stirring well until the sugar dissolves. Add the sugar syrup to the lemon juice and top with 4 cups water. Taste to make sure it's sweet enough for you, then add the raspberries. (Keep in mind that the raspberries are tart, so be sure to sweeten enough!) Stir the lemonade, then chill in the fridge.

2. Fill mason jars with ice cubes and top them off with the lemonade.

#### Blueberry French Toast Casserole with Whipped Cream and Strawberries

2 tablespoons unsalted butter, plus extra for buttering the dish One 1-pound day-old loaf challah or white bread, unsliced Two 6-ounce containers blueberries (about 2 1/4 cups) 6 large eggs 3 cups milk 1 1/4 cups heavy cream 2/3 cup plus 2 tablespoons granulated sugar 1/2 teaspoon pure almond extract 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt One 16-ounce container strawberries, sliced One 6-ounce container raspberries 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract Confectioners' sugar, for dusting, optional



1. Grease the bottom and sides of a 9-by-13-inch baking dish with butter. Slice the bread into 3/4-to-1-inch-thick slices. If your bread is very fresh, lightly toast the slices before assembling. Tile all the bread in the dish, each slice overlapping the next. Scatter the blueberries over the bread, letting some fall to the bottom of the dish. Whisk the eggs, milk, 1/2 cup cream, 2/3 cup granulated sugar, almond extract and salt in a medium bowl until the sugar is dissolved. Pour over the bread and berries and press gently to help the bread start soaking in the egg mixture. Cut the 2 tablespoons butter into small pieces and dot over the top of the casserole. Cover with plastic wrap and let stand in the refrigerator 8 hours or overnight. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Remove and discard the plastic wrap. Bake the casserole until golden brown and set in the center, 45 to 50 minutes, tenting with foil if the bread starts to become too dark. Let stand 10 minutes. Dust with confectioners' sugar if desired. While the casserole bakes, toss the strawberries and raspberries with 1 tablespoon granulated sugar in a medium bowl and let stand until juicy. Before serving, whip the remaining 3/4 cup cream with the remaining 1 tablespoon granulated sugar and vanilla until soft peaks form. Serve the casserole with a dollop of whipped cream and a generous spoonful of the berries with their juices.



#### **Celebrating 50 Years of Spreading Holiday Cheer!**


On February 26, 2023 at Royalty West Banquets in Willow Springs, Illinois, many gathered to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Chicago Polish Carolers. Entertainment was provided by the Music Company as well as The Chicago Polish Carolers themselves.

For those you may not know, the Chicago Polish Carolers began back in 1972 when Chet Kowalkowski and Stas Bulanda wanted to bring back the tradition of caroling during the holiday season as generations before used to do. They played traditional koledy at a few lounges in Chicago with just a trumpet and a concertina. Since they received such a great response, they continued the tradition year after year, adding more carolers to the group. They expanded the locations they visited to the homebound, veterans, nursing homes, local businesses, lounges and friends' holiday parties. Now 50 years later, under the continued leadership of Chet Kowalkowski and Tony Blazonczyk, the Chicago Polish Carolers have over 80 polka musicians in the Chicagoland area who spend every weekend in December caroling for friends, families, and the less fortunate. In recent years they even started visiting other states to spread the Christmas spirit.

Being from the Chicago area, I've been extremely lucky to see the Chicago Polish Carolers countless times. Since my dad joined the carolers 10+ years ago, I always look forward to the stories he would tell about the reactions of who they would visit. I was blessed to be at my Grandmother's nursing home for a few holiday seasons when the carolers came to sing. To see the faces of the elderly just light up with pure joy was truly amazing and heartwarming. I get goosebumps just thinking about it! I also have memories from when I was young of the carolers showing up at my house because they were in the neighborhood and wanted to come play for my family.




