IPA Board Requirements

Listed below are the requirements for candidacy for the IPA Board of Directors. Also listed are the positions that are up for re-election in 2016. Elections will be held Sunday, September 4, during the IPA Convention in Buffalo, New York.

<u>All Positions</u>: Nominees shall not occupy any appointed or elected office of any other polka association. No nomination shall be valid unless agreed to by the nominee, either orally or in writing, at the time of the nomination.

President (1-year term) and 2nd Vice President (2-year term): Nominee must have served at least <u>two or more years</u> on the Executive Board.

The following positions are a 2-year term and require nominees to be a member in good standing for one full year:

- 2nd Vice President
- Financial Secretary
- Treasurer
- 3 Illinois Directors
- 3 Non-Illinois Directors

Requirements: Nominees must have the capability to communicate using e-mail **and** dial-in conference calls. Meetings are generally held on Tuesdays, but flexibility in this regard is appreciated.



IPA Polka Hall of Fame Inductees

Richard Midura Pioneer Category



Richard Midura was born on August 12, 1935 in Known as the "Pioneer of Polka Chicopee, MA. Clarinet Improvisation" by his peers, he lent his smooth clarinet and saxophone mastery to the live performances and recordings of the most prominent eastern-style polka bands of his day. Richard's unique playing style influenced generations of polka Over his career he toured with Ed clarinetists. Swierand's Aristocrats, Al Soyka, and Gene Wisniewski, and performed and recorded with Eddie Siwicki, Al Cocoa, Walt Solek, Ray Henry, and the Connecticut Twins. On June 7, 1956, Richard appeared on national television performing the "Clarinet Polka" on The Ed Sullivan Show. Later in life, he helped raise money for polka broadcasting by hosting radio shows on WMUA in Massachusetts.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Richard Midura has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Don Jodlowski Deceased Category



Don Jodlowski was born on August 30, 1940 into a musical family that lived on the southwest side of Chicago, IL. His family's love for polka music inspired him to take drum lessons at a young age. Don developed his skills so that by the 1960s he was drumming with bands that included Joe "Pat" Paterek, Johnny Bomba, Li'l Richard Towalski, Li'l Wally Jagiello, The Ampol Aires, and Frankie Yankovic. He was the regular drummer for the Polkaliers, who recorded an album on Marion Lush's Dyno label, and the leader of the Vibrasounds, who recorded "Polka Magic" on Eddie Blazonczyk's Bel-Aire label. In 1968, Don teamed up with Eddie Blazonczyk, Johnny Hyzny, Leon Kozicki, and Joe & Jean Salomon to form the International Polka Association. He held various offices on the executive board over many years. In the 1970s, Don co-hosted the "Don and Don" and "Polkarama" radio shows.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Don Jodlowski has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

IPA Polka Hall of Fame Inductees

Carl Finch Living Category



Carl Finch was born in Texarkana, TX on November 29, 1951. He began performing at the early age of 4 years old by singing in church choirs and later spent his high school years forming and playing in rock bands in northeast Texas. Carl minored in music at University of North Texas and formed Brave Combo in Denton, TX in 1979. This began a 35-year legacy of playing original and innovating arrangements of music that incorporated diverse dance styles including polka, Latin American, and Caribbean. The band was nominated for GRAMMY awards seven times, winning twice in 1999 and 2004 and had its music featured in various movies and television programs. An animated version of Brave Combo was even featured in an episode of the acclaimed TV series, The Simpsons. A renowned guitarist, keyboardist, accordionist, vocalist, recording artist, record producer, and bandleader, Carl Finch has enjoyed a remarkable music career.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Carl Finch has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Dean Hansen Living Category




Dean Hansen was born in Ithaca, NE in April of 1933 into a farming family of German ancestry. He was stricken with polio at the age of four and suffered paralysis of his right leg. Fearing his condition would prevent Dean from ever farming, his parents introduced him to music by buying him an accordion. After several surgeries he was able to walk and take music lessons from various teachers including Fritz Poppe, who influenced Dean's distinctive style. He quickly developed his skills and went on to tour with the Herb Molter Polka Band in 1951, The Sparta Band in 1953, and The Eddie Janak Band in 1958. In 1971, Dean joined the Ernie Kucera Band and recorded several albums. In 1979, Dean formed a family band with his children and other skilled musicians. His musical excellence and reputation as an exceptional bandleader resulted in his induction into the Sokol Omaha Polka Hall of Fame in 1989.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Dean Hansen has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame[®].

IPA Polka Hall of Fame Inductee

Stanley "Stas" Golonka Living Category



Stanley "Stas" Golonka was born in 1944 into a Polish family in Chicago. He was raised in a Polish neighborhood, attended a Polish school, and listened regularly to Polish radio programs. Inspired by the music of Li'l Wally, Stas developed his vocal and drumming skills and formed his first band, The Polka Diamonds, in the late 1950s. After his return from service in the U.S. Army in 1967, Stas resumed his musical career and performed with polka greats that included Li'l Wally and Marion Lush. In the late 1970s, he formed his most well-known band, The Chicago Masters. The group went on to tour nationally and record nine albums where Stas' Dean Martin-like vocals and energetic rhythms helped him become known as "The King of Honky." His music achieved national acclaim by being included on a compilation recording called "Deeper Polka," produced by the Smithsonian Institute.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Stanley "Stas" Golonka has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Leon Kozicki Award

Eric Parks



Over the years, the IPA Polka Hall of Fame® and Music Awards processes have rightfully recognized deserving polka musicians who attained prominence in the polka industry for their musical achievements that helped promote polka music and broaden its audience. Because of their highly visible roles, bandleaders, or "front men and women," usually received most of the recognition for their groups' success that may have contributed to their winning individual awards or their eventual inductions into the Polka Hall of Fame. Unfortunately, exceptionally talented band mates who also contributed greatly to the success of their groups, often never received their due recognition.

To address this situation, the IPA Polka Hall of Fame and Music Awards Committee collaborated with the body of Trustees to establish an annual award to recognize these deserving "side men or women" of notable polka bands. To honor the legacy of the long-time Chairman of the IPA Polka Hall of Fame, Leon Kozicki, the committee and Trustees also recommended the award be titled "The Leon Kozicki Trustees Award."

This year's recipient of the Leon Kozicki Trustees Award is Eric Parks. Eric has been a member of the Jimmy Sturr Orchestra for over 40 years. During that time he was the leader of the Jazz Knights at West Point. He served in the military for 20 years. He retired as a Sgt. Major. He has recorded over 100 of albums with the Jimmy Sturr Orchestra as the lead trumpet player and trumpet soloist. Eric continues in music today as a music teacher in upstate New York. His contributions and accomplishments in the polka industry have set the standards for excellence very high.

IPA Hall of Famer David "Scrubby" Seweryniak Passes

An explosive entertainer, polka dynamite, and charged with TNT describes one of the 1994 Polka Music Hall of Fames inductees. Born on the Fourth of July and growing up on the East Side of Buffalo, known as the city's Polonia, "Scrubby" was exposed to polka music at a very early age.

When he was six he started to play the accordion, first by ear, then with formal lessons. Later in his early teens, he went to see Li'l Wally perform. He was in awe with the performance he had given to the crowd at a local dance, his vocals and concertina and the Chicago style of music was something to which he had taken affection. At age sixteen, he started to play the concertina, and that has been his main instrument for over thirty years.

Back in 1965, Scrubby formed his own band known as the Dave Seweryniak Trio. In 1968 he was introduced to Larry Trojak, who at the time was the leader of Buffalo's Casino's. That same year, Scrubby joined Larry's band and the name was changed to Larry Trojak's Dynatones. In 1970, Larry was called to the service, and Scrubby took over leadership of the band and led the band for 20 years.



Throughout his polka career, Scrubby & The Dynatones have won numerous awards from The IPA, USPA, Disc-Jockey's and others to name a few. Scrubby has been decorated with many male vocalists awards through the years. In 1992 their album entitled "When the Band Plays a Polka" was nominated by NARAS to receive the prestigious Grammy Award. For a brief period of time (1985-87), Scrubby was a member of the Sunshine Polka Band. The group has recorded several albums.

His performances on stage from the donning of a muumuu, to a Dracula Cape have been unequaled by anyone in the polka field. Scrubby credits Liberace with his costume antics on stage, remarking "Let me slip into something a little more comfortable." His love for polka music not only consisted of playing and singing, but also to help form the Buffalo Polka Boosters, which celebrated 25 years in 1995.

In addition, he has always been active in the promotion of, and willing to lend a helping hand to, many in the industry. His wish is to continue to make contributions to the polka industry, either by performing on stage or behind the scenes. He also hopes to expose more and more younger people into the wonderful world of polka music, either by becoming musicians or promoting polkas as an enthusiastic way of life.

In August, 1994, his buddy, Larry Trojak, and many of his friends and family from the Buffalo area were on hand to see the one, the only, "'Scrubby" inducted into polka music's elite group. The International Polka Association's Polka Music Hall of Fame welcomed its newest member, Dave "Scrubby" Seweryniak.

Scrubby passed away on July 22 after a lengthy, courageous battle with cancer.






