This year marks the 50th anniversary of the International Polka Association. We have many exciting events planned for this year, and we hope you're able to join us in Buffalo for our 50th anniversary festival and convention!

#### How the International Polka Association Began

The concept of a national polka convention had been developed and pioneered originally in Chicago. From the popular yearly moonlight dances starting in 1960, which attracted thousands of polka lovers from all sections of the United States and Canada — the first polka convention emerged in 1963. This developed into the International Polka Convention which was presented each succeeding year in Chicago, Detroit and Buffalo, New York.

In January, 1968 a steering committee comprised of Johnny Hyzny, Leon Kozicki, Joe and Jean Salomon, Eddie Blazonczyk and Don Jodlowski met to discuss plans for the next convention. After a series of meetings they began preparations for the formation of the International Polka Association. The Association was officially chartered by the State of Illinois as a "not for profit" corporation and was registered with the County of Cook (Chicago) in August of 1968.

Since 1968 the International Polka Festival has been presented under the auspices of the International Polka Association. The delegates to the 1968 Convention approved the establishment of the Polka Music Hall of Fame and the presentation of annual Polka Music Awards.

As stated in its charter, the International Polka Association was organized as: "An educational and charitable organization for the preservation, promulgation and advancement of polka music and; to promote, maintain and advance public interest in polka entertainment; to advance the mutual interests and encourage greater cooperation among its members who are engaged in polka entertainment; and to encourage and pursue the study of polka music, dancing and traditional folklore."

The International Polka Association presents many special awards each year to encourage the promotion of polka music. Through the efforts of the IPA, the month of January has been proclaimed as National Polka Music Month and the annual festival has served as a show place for new, deserving polka talent. Many functions under the auspices of the IPA are presented in various states, a weekly radio program has been established and a bi-monthly news bulletin keeps the members informed of the business affairs of the Association, as well as polka related events and news from across the country.

The International Polka Association is also responsible for the continued operation and growth of the Polka Music Hall of Fame and Museum. It is through this branch that the Association has been able to continue its historical, educational and research goals on behalf of the polka music industry.

#### IPA Expands Polka Music Awards

Every year, the International Polka Association conducts balloting for its annual Polka Music Awards that determines the Favorite Polish Style Polka Album, Favorite Polish Style Polka Song, Favorite International Style Polka Song, Favorite Male Vocalist, Favorite Female Vocalist, and Favorite Band. The process is conducted under the auspices of the IPA Polka Hall of Fame/ Music Awards Committee through the voting of the national academy of IPA Trustees and Electors who represent geographic portions of the USA and Canada and the various polka music styles that compose the polka industry in North America.

In keeping with its mission to preserve and promote polka music of all styles, the IPA has expanded the awards to include Favorite International Style Polka Band, Favorite International Style Male Vocalist, and Favorite International Style Female Vocalist beginning with the current awards cycle. The former Favorite Band, Favorite Male Vocalist, and Favorite Female Vocalist awards will be renamed Favorite Polish Style Band, Favorite Polish Style Male Vocalist, and Favorite Polish Style Female Vocalist to clearly define the polka styles of the award winners as with the other awards.

A Polka Hall of Fame/Music Awards Banquet is conducted every year to honor the deserving award recipients. This year's banquet will take place on Saturday, September 1st at the Millennium Hotel in Buffalo, NY as part of the IPA's Annual Polka Festival and Convention this Labor Day Weekend. 2018 also happens to be the 50th Anniversary of the IPA's official charter as an official "not-for-profit" corporation. The Passing of Ed & Jeanne Szela

Ed Szela was elected IPA Director from Massachusetts in August 1999. He was born in Thompsonville, Connecticut, the son of Polish immigrants. His parents were actively involved in the Polish community, volunteering their services at local polka dances where Eddie developed his love of polka music and learned to speak Polish fluently at an early age. Eddie married his wife, Jeanne, on October 23, 1965.

They met at a polka dance, and along with their two daughters, Sue & Sandy, they traveled throughout the country attending numerous polka festivals, Polish picnics, and polka cruises. Eddie & Jeanne reside in Longmeadow, Massachusetts where they host an annual Christmas Party at "Club Szela"- Where the Party Never Ends!

Ed had always been dedicated to keeping polka music alive, not only by supporting various clubs and polka bands by attending their dances, but also by being an active member of the IPA and other polka organizations. He had for may years, along with Freddy Kendzierski, run a benefit for the IPA Hall of Fame at the Ludlow PACC with several thousand dollars of proceeds donated to the Hall of Fame Fund.

He was a dedicated board member of the Ludlow PACC and held the position of Dance Committee Chairman donating his time and efforts to bringing many popular polka bands from near and far to entertain the polka fans. He also organized many bus trips to various polka weekends and Polka Festivals. Ed was honored by the Ludlow PACC with the Citizen of the Year Award for 2010, and by the IPA with the Joe Jozwiak Award for 2012.

Ed passed away on January 9, and Jeanne passed away on January 19. They both will be sorely missed; may the rest in peace together.



#### Chet Schafer Passes

Chet Schafer, a cultural beacon in Chicago's Polish-American community, passed away on April 11, 2018, at the age of 95. He was a family patriarch, polka radio disc jockey and music producer, and champion of Polish culture. He inspired those around him by sharing his love of Polish music and culture and faith in God.

Chet Schafer was born Chester Aloysius Szafraniec in 1922 in Chicago to Karolina and Henryk Szafraniec, who were recent Polish immigrants. He grew up in Wicker Park and had seven siblings: Hank, Joseph, Frank, Mike, Tony, Helen, and Wanda. Schafer served in an administrative capacity during World War II. After completing his service, he took journalism and broadcasting classes at Northwestern University on the GI Bill.

Chet married Dolores Mendygral in 1950. They lived in the West Humbolt Park neighborhood and raised a family of thirteen children. The family even occupied two adjacent houses on Walton Street for many years. All members of the family were active members of St. Francis of Assisi parish.



Chet spent many years working a day job as part-owner of Hollywood Press, a Wicker Park printing firm, with his brothers Tony and Frank. The family moved to the Mont Clare neighborhood in 1990. Chet Schafer's radio career spanned over 65 years. He got his start co-hosting a polka program with musician Lil' Wally Jagiello on Chicago station WCRW in 1950. In 1952, Chet started his own "Polka Hit Parade" program on LaGrange station WTAQ, using the popular TV program "Your Hit Parade" as a model. In 1954 he expanded to another radio program on WTAQ, on which he held the first polka band popularity contest in the Chicagoland area. He received over 22,000 pieces of mail for this contest, which was featured in Reader's Digest magazine.

Chet's polka music has also been broadcast from Oak Park station WPNA before he found his long-term home on the airwaves at WCEV 1450 AM in 1986. The Sunday afternoon "Chet Schafer Show" was broadcast on WCEV until November 2017. Chet was known as the "Dean of Chicagoland's Polka Broadcasters." He is believed to have one of the longest-running radio careers in the Chicago area and one of the longest-running polka radio shows in the country. Chet was also the first in Chicago to produce live polka stage shows. These were variety shows which featured live bands, vocalists, dancing groups, and comedy skits. Chet performed live broadcasts of his radio show at local polka dances and outdoor festivals. He also co-hosted the polka segment of the "Polonia Today" TV show in WCIU Channel 26 in the 1980s.

In addition to his radio activities, Chet owned the Chicago Polkas recording label since 1952. He produced 10" 78 rpm records, 45s, 8-tracks, cassettes, LPs, and CDs by artists such as the Pala Brothers, the 47th Street Concertina Club, Lil' Richard, the Hi-Notes, and Staś Bulanda. He released over 100 albums. One of Chicago Polkas' last recordings was an album of music composed by and for the Polish and American war hero Thaddeus Kosciuszko. Throughout his life, Chet was active in a number of community organizations, including the Polonus Philatelic Society, the International Polka Association (IPA), the Senior Polka Association (SPA), the Polish American Cultural Club, and the Polish Roman Catholic Union of America. He wrote articles for such publications as Polka Guide, Polka World, and I.P.A. News. Chet donated a 1794 handwritten document by Polish military and American Revolutionary War hero Tadeusz Kosciuszko to the Polish Museum of America. In 2004, Chet and Dolores received the Polish Spirit Award from the Polish Museum of America. That same year, Dolores passed away. Chet married Geraldine Ryndak in 2010 at the age of 88, showing that he never gave up on life, love, and happiness. Geraldine passed away in 2013. Chet remained active with his radio show and recording label until his health declined in 2017. He passed away due to kidney disease.

Chet also served as First Vice President of the International Polka Association. May he rest in peace

After much discussion, the International Polka Association (IPA) voted to honor those worthy individuals with the establishment of the Special Achievement Award. To pay tribute to Joe Jozwiak, following his passing, this award was renamed the Joe Jozwiak Special Achievement Award. The award is given to recognize polka personalities who might not otherwise be acknowledged for their dauntless contributions. Nominees can include DJs, polka writers, promoters, ballroom operators, etc.; bands and musicians are excluded.
