IPA Polka Hall of Fame Inductees

Joseph Macielag Pioneer Category



Joseph Macielag began his musical career with clarinet lessons at the age of 14. Two years later, he was invited to join the Rydzewski Brothers Trio from Niagara Falls, NY. Influenced by Frank Wojnarowski, Joseph organized a nine-piece orchestra that played its first gig when he was only 18. By the age of 21, he was on the road with his band backing up the famed vocalist, Marisha Data. Later, Joseph's Pic-A-Polka Orchestra teamed up with Frank Wojnarowski to produce the "Pic-A-Polka" TV show on Buffalo's Channel 2, WGR-TV. The band went on to back up many polka hall of fame vocalists which lead to Joseph headlining the popular TV show. To this day, his band is considered one of the finest groups to come out of western New York. In addition to being a celebrated bandleader and musician, he became a respected vocalist, arranger, promoter, and historian of eastern-style polka music. Joseph was also very active in the Polish American community, having served as President of the western New York division of the Polish American Congress.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Joseph Macielag has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Leon "Bud" Hundenski Deceased Category



Leon "Bud" Hundenski was born in Canonsburg, PA on July 26, 1944. After his dad bought him his first accordion, he started taking private lessons at age 9. As a youth, Bud won many solo amateur contests and he formed his own trio by the time he was in Junior High School. At 17, he accepted an invitation to join Pittsburgh's Bob Gazda Band and went on to record and perform with the popular group until he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1965. After serving his duty, he collaborated with skilled musicians to form Bud Hudenski and The Corsairs. The band's first album, "Polkas That Swing," featuring Bud's original hit composition of the same name, won national acclaim. Over the next four decades, the band recorded ten albums, appeared on various TV shows, and toured through much of the U.S. and Canada. In 2011, their "Resurgence" album won the Polka America Corporation of Excellence (PACE) "Polka Album of the Year" award. An accomplished bandleader, TV-recording artist, composer, publisher, musician, family man, and humanitarian, Bud passed away on January 23, 2016.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Leon "Bud" Hundenski has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Mollie Busta Lange Living Category



Mollie Busta Lange, commonly known as "Mollie B," has been active in the polka industry her entire life. She began at age 3 on vocals with The Jim Busta Band, and to date, has performed in 35 states and 11 countries in addition to appearing on over 35 recordings. Always involving polka music, Mollie has been an educator and role model through her perfordance lessons, and school workmances. shops. While best known as the host and a coproducer of the nationally syndicated TV program the "Mollie B Polka Party," she has also co-hosted a Sirius XM Radio Show, performed in the Warner Brothers film, "The Mule;" hosted the Wisconsin PBS documentary, "POLKA!"; performed on the National PBS Special, "Polka Passion;" performed on the "Big Joe Polka Show:" and has produced and directed large Christmas shows in Branson and beyond. Mollie performs on many instruments with SqueezeBox, is in the Wisconsin & Iowa Polka Halls of Fame, and has been named the "Favorite Female Vocalist" multiple years by the USPA & IPA.

For her many accomplishments in the polka industry, Mollie Busta Lange has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Gary Brueggen Living Category



Gary Brueggen was born in the small farming community of Cashton, WI where at the young age of 2 he became captivated by polka music he heard on the radio. Recognizing his potential, Gary's parents bought him his first set of drums at 5 years old and by the time he was 9, he played his first job with The Ridgeland Dutchmen. At age 10, he was given his first concertina, which began his magical career with the bellowed instrument. Gary eventually took over leadership of the band with his father and uncle and they became a favorite throughout the Midwest, toured nationally and internationally, and went on to record 16 albums and two DVDs for the Mollie B Polka Party on RFD-TV. Along with concertina and drums, Gary taught himself to play piano, button box, tuba, trumpet, and valve trombone and is proud to represent the 17th generation of the Brueggen family musical legacy. Over the years, he also found time to perform and record with a host of other bands and to broadcast polka music on various radio stations.

For his many accomplishments in the polka industry, Gary Brueggen has been deemed deserving by the electorate of the International Polka Association for induction into the Polka Music Hall of Fame®.

Press Release: IPA Celebrates Fifty Years

Chicago, IL— The International Polka Association (IPA), an organization dedicated to the promotion and advancement of polka music, will be celebrating its 50th Anniversary with an International Polka Festival and Awards Banquet, being held August 31 to September 2, 2018 in Buffalo, NY.

The event, which draws polka fans from throughout the country, will present some of polka music's top-name bands over the three days and will also feature its annual banquet and awards ceremony, at which both bands and individuals are honored for their efforts in polkas. A highlight of the awards banquet is the induction of five individuals into the International Polka Music Hall of Fame.

"This is an exciting time for the IPA as we not only reflect on our accomplishments of the past half-century, but we also look forward to possibilities for what lies ahead," said Rick Rzeszutko, IPA president. "We've witnessed a lot over these last 50 years. And although we've seen the music go through some very lean times, we are currently seeing a real resurgence in the interest in polkas. We are seeing more and more young people at dances and festivals, as well as a growing number of young musicians who *want* to play polkas. That's an amazing thing to see and bodes well for the future of our genre."

This year's IPA Hall of Fame inductees will be honored in an awards ceremony to be held Saturday, September 1, 2018. They include: Mollie Busta Lange and Gary Brueggen (Living Category); Leon "Bud" Hundenski (Deceased Category); and Joe Macielag (Pioneer Category). Rich Bernier will receive the coveted Leon Kozicki Award for his 50+ years of work with polka bands throughout New England.

In addition to the "main event" being held in Buffalo, the IPA will also host a 50th Anniversary celebration in Chicago, offering a mass, sit-down polish-style dinner with cocktails, and music by "The Boys". This exciting event will take place at the legendary Polonia Banquets on October 28, 2018. "This will be a semi-formal affair that will give us a chance to celebrate — in style — in Chicago, the city in which the IPA was originally founded," said Rzeszutko. "We are excited for it all."

A Half Century of Polkas

In polka music, as in the world outside of it, the year 1968 ranks as one of the most pivotal in modern memory. While that year marks a time when the country was reeling in political and social unrest, polkas were instead exploding with the debut of new bands, new festivals and, most importantly, new organizations to further promote this unique, infectious genre of music. Heading up a push to formalize that effort was an upstart group of Chicago-based promoters, radio personalities, musicians, and business leaders who, recognizing the appeal of the music and the potential it held, wanted to broaden its reach. Their collective efforts led to the founding of the International Polka Association (IPA) which, in 2018, is proudly celebrating a major milestone with its 50th Anniversary. And, in true polka fashion, hundreds of rabid polka fans from throughout the country will help the IPA mark this memorable occasion, at the organization's 50th Annual International Polka Festival being held over the Labor Day weekend in Buffalo, NY.

Windy City Roots

With a Polish population that, at the time, was second only to Warsaw, Poland, it's not surprising that the concept of a national polka convention was developed and pioneered in Chicago. The home to immensely popular yearly moonlight dances which attracted thousands of polka lovers from all parts of the U.S. and Canada – Chicago hosted its first polka convention in 1963. Dubbed the "International Polka Convention," the event was presented in succeeding years in Chicago, Detroit, and Buffalo.

In January of 1968, a steering committee comprised of musician and tavern owner Johnny Hyzny; musician Leon Kozicki; tavern proprietors Joe and Jean Salomon; and musicians Eddie Blazonczyk and Don Jodlowski met to discuss plans for the next convention. After a series of meetings they soon realized that the formal establishment of an organization dedicated to the advancement of polka music was needed. In August of that year, the International Polka Association was formed and officially chartered by the State of Illinois as a "not for profit" corporation and registered with the County of Cook (Chicago, Illinois).

The goals of the International Polka Association are the same today as they were in 1968. As stated in its charter, the IPA was organized as: "An educational and charitable organization for the preservation, promulgation and advancement of polka music and; to promote, maintain and advance public interest in polka entertainment; to advance the mutual interests and encourage greater cooperation among its members who are engaged in polka entertainment; and to encourage and pursue the study of polka music, dancing and traditional folklore."

A Pair of Kings

Since 1968, the International Polka Festival has been presented under the auspices of the International Polka Association. Not satisfied simply providing a single event at which polka lovers could express their love for the music, the delegates to the 1968 Convention approved the establishment of the Polka Music Hall of Fame and the annual presentation of its Polka Music Awards.

Seeing efforts made by their counterparts in other music genres to honor musicians who truly excelled at their craft, leaders in the polka industry had, for years, contemplated the formation of an institution that could also properly recognize deserving performers, recording artists, TV and radio personalities, promoters, and other professionals in the polka field. Never a group to shy away from added responsibility, the delegates to the 1968 International Polka Association Convention approved the establishment of the Polka Music Hall of Fame to honor those who made significant contributions to the advancement and promotion of polka music. The following year, famed Clevelander Frankie Yankovic and Chicago native Li'l Wally Jagiello – each who bore the title of "America's Polka King" – were the inaugural inductees into the International Polka Association's Polka Music Hall of Fame.

It's an Honor

Over the years, many enhancements have been made to the manner in which individuals are elected into the Polka Music Hall of Fame. Currently, twelve trustees, who oversee an academy of 180 national electors, administer the functions of the institution. Each year the academy elects four polka personalities for Hall of Fame induction: two living, one deceased, and one in the organization's "pioneer" category. To qualify, all candidates must have demonstrated at least twenty-five years of dedicated service in the polka industry, accomplished significant achievements, and attained national notoriety. Additional honors are awarded to personalities who have either excelled as sidemen or sidewomen in polka groups, or contributed to polkas in a peripheral manner such as through promotion, broadcasting, etc.

A Half Century of Polkas - Continued

That same academy also votes for the annual winners of the IPA Polka Music Awards in categories such as Favorite Polish-Style CD; Favorite Polish-Style Song; Favorite Polish Style Male Vocalist, etc. Similar selections are made for International-Style honorees as well. A third-party professional auditor is retained and entrusted to tabulate the ballots, certify the winners, and report all election results to the IPA Executive Board.

Additional Contributions

Largely through the efforts of the IPA, the month of January has been proclaimed "National Polka Music Month." Doing so has proven successful in raising the awareness of polkas as a whole and encouraging additional promotion through dances and other events. The annual International Polka Festival, in addition to featuring proven, successful talent, has also served as a showcase for new, deserving polka talent, thereby helping solidify the continued growth of the genre. Other IPA contributions include: a host of functions conducted under the auspices of the IPA that are regularly presented in various states; establishment of a weekly IPA radio program; a monthly news bulletin that keeps members informed of the organization's business affairs, as well as polka-related events and news from across the country; a website and a fledgling social media presence.

In keeping with its mission to "preserve, promulgate, and grow public interest in polka music," the International Polka Association also provides continuous financial support to sustain and improve the Polka Music Hall of Fame and Museum. In addition to honoring deserving polka personalities, the museum contains an impressive collection of polkarelated artifacts, sheet music, recordings, and memorabilia, and makes it all available — by appointment — as an educational resource for anyone interested in polka music. The collection is currently displayed at Polonia Banquets, 4608 S. Archer Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

IPA Board Requirements

Listed below are the requirements for candidacy for the IPA Board of Directors. Also listed are the positions that are up for re-election in 2018. Elections will be held Sunday, September 2, during the IPA Convention in Buffalo, New York.

<u>All Positions</u>: Nominees shall not occupy any appointed or elected office of any other polka association. No nomination shall be valid unless agreed to by the nomine. A willingness to seek and accept office must be done in person at the general meeting. If unable to attend the annual meeting, candidates may also submit a signed letter. Such letters can be submitted for consideration in any of the following ways: brought to the meeting by another member, given to an officer or director in advance of the meeting, mailed to the IPA - 4608 South Archer Avenue; Chicago, IL 60632, or emailed to ipapolkas@gmail.com.

Positions up for re-election in 2018:

- President
 - 1-year term, must reside in Illinois and must have served at least two years on the Executive Board
- 2nd Vice President
 - 2-year term, must reside outside of Illinois and be a member in good standing for one year
- Financial Secretary
 - 2-year term, must reside in Illinois and be a member in good standing for one year
- (3) Illinois Directors
 - 2-year term, must reside in Illinois and be a member in good standing for one year
- (3) Non-Illinois Directors
 - 2-year term, must reside outside of Illinois and be a member in good standing for one year.

Requirements: Nominees must have the capability to communicate using e-mail **and** dial-in conference calls. Meetings are generally held on Tuesdays, but flexibility in this regard is appreciated.

IPA Reaches 1,000 Member Goal!!


