

## **Attention IPA Hall of Fame Candidates!**

The process for polka professionals who would like to be considered for possible IPA Hall of Fame induction has been electronically simplified! No more hard copy writing, printing, and physical mailing! Candidates just need to go online to https://www.ipapolkas.com/application -hof/ and upload their biographies into the new electronic biography submission application. With the click of a button their information is forwarded to the Board of Trustees for review. Remember, to determine if a candidate is qualified to be placed on the HOF ballot, the trustees look at three areas: 1.) Experience (must have 25 years or more of dedicated professional experience in the polka industry), 2.) Awards, Accomplishments, Achievements, and 3.) Contributions toward Preserving and Advancing the Polka Music Industry. Contact information for references is also required. Complete instructions are available on the website. The deadline to submit for consideration in the next voting cycle is December 31, 2020. Questions may be directed to HallOfFame@ipapolkas.com.

# Attention Polka Artists Vying for IPA Awards!

Polka artists interested in possible music awards recognition now have an easy electronic method to get on the ballot! Beginning this year, all working polka artists seeking IPA awards for the current year must go online to www.ipapolkas.com/application-musicawards to submit their information. All those who register are eligible for the IPA's Favorite Band and Favorite Vocalist award categories. Recording artists have a special section to upload their musical tracks and graphics to be considered for their additional awards. In all, deserving polka artists are recognized with music awards that Favorite include Album. Favorite Song, Favorite Band, Favorite Male Vocalist, and Favorite Female Vocalist for Polish and (Slovenian, International Czech, German, Dutchmen, etc.) polka styles. An academy of 195 electors from across the country determines the award winners by casting their votes on annual ballots. The lists of polka artists on these ballots will be generated by the submissions received through the new electronic process. So, you've got to submit every year to win! Complete instructions are available on the website. The deadline to submit for consideration in the next voting cycle is January 14, 2021. Eligible recordings must have been released between January 1 and December 31, 2020. Questions may be directed to MusicAwards@ipapolkas.com.

Known as "Classic Music" KCHK (500 -watts) features vintage country; 50's-60's rock and roll, and is best known for playing polka music for the Czechs (hence, the station's call letters KCHK) that settled the area starting in the mid-1850s. KCHK's signal covers a large area of Southern Minnesota including the cities of Faribault, Northfield, Cannon Falls, Mankato, New Ulm, Saint Peter, Jordan, Waconia, and also "skirts" the Southwestern suburbs of Minneapolis. KCHK can also be found streaming on the Internet at kchkradio.net.

According to KCHK's general manager, Tom Goetzinger, "KCHK Radio proudly calls itself the Polka Place! It's Polka Time will now be a fantastic finishing touch to an entire Sunday offering of polka music starting at 6am, with this show wrapping up the programming from 9-11pm. In addition to the whole day on Sunday, K-Check plays polka music 5-8am and 1-3pm Monday through Friday."



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## IPA is Virtually Flawless in Labor Day Presentation

uppose they gave a polka festival and nobody came.

That rhetorical situation became reality over the Labor Day weekend as the International Polka Association® (IPA), forced, like most of the polka world, to cancel their annual convention and awards banquet, tried their hand at a virtual festival. Broadcast via Facebook, YouTube and the Polka Jammer Network, the weekend-long venture turned what could have been an exercise in futility into a fun, informative and truly enjoyable event.

At this point in our "new" existence, there is no one who isn't frustrated at the situation in which we find ourselves vis a vis COVID 19. So, it was refreshing to see the IPA, which could have just chosen to throw up their hands and focus on next year's event, instead take this bowl of 2020 lemons and deal up a sweet-tasting lemonade.

Perhaps sensing the degree to which we are all live-music-deprived, the virtual fest offered instudio performances courtesy of Tony Blazonczyk's New Phase, The Steve Meisner Band, The IPA Tribute Band, and The DynaBrass. That, however, proved to be just a jumping-off point. The organization peppered the weekend with additional video clips of performances from other groups, many of which were originally scheduled for the actual festival; interviews with past and present IPA Hall of Famers; game shows; a tour of the IPA Hall of Fame; faux news broadcasts; and more. Full disclosure: I am not one to sit at a laptop, TV, or tablet for any length of time without said device showing The Princess Bride or Parks and Rec reruns. Yet I found myself doing just that and being continually impressed with the amount of effort put into both the visuals and the content. Expecting a bare-bones presentation, I was pleasantly surprised by the slick transition graphics; the tacky — but spot-on — "news" set (loved the halfdozen pairs of glasses scattered about); even the stacked pallets that provided a nice, industrial look

for the live band performances.

Every quality program needs a solid emcee and the IPA had two at their disposal for its virtual festival. Minnesota's quintessential DJ/IJ/musician Craig Ebel did most of the heavy lifting, handling band intros, chat room announcements, promotions, small talk, etc., po and did a great job, appearing casual yet pro-

fessional. For the game show segments ("Name that Polka" and a Jeopardy-like "Polka Trivia") that provided a nice break from standard polka festival fare, the IPA went to the bullpen for Chicago's Keith Stras. Channeling the vibe of '70s TV hosts Chuck Woolery, Bob Ewbanks, Gene Rayburn and the like, Stras, obviously in his comfort zone, kept the segments interesting, funny and flowing.

Were there glitches? Of course, there were. This was, after all, a first-ever attempt at such a massive undertaking. So, it was easy to overlook things like the occasional dead microphone or the horrible lighting during the first night's live performances that looked, at times, like either a bad acid flashback or the performers were suffering from third-degree burns. It was all resolved by the second night, however, and no one was the worse for wear.

After watching the three-day affair, it became evident that one of the real advantages an event like this offers over even an actual polka festival is its ability to communicate one-on-one with its audience. And when the message being offered is Polka Hall of Famers (both newly-inducted and Hall veterans) imparting their career highlights, likes, anecdotes and recollections via video, this particular medium was ideal. For young, aspiring musicians in particular, the video presentations were an invaluable opportunity

to gain firsthand knowledge and advice from those who have risen to the top in their respective fields. Chances are slim that such an opportunity would present itself in a hall crowded with 500+ polka fans. So, if there was anything of a silver lining to this COVID-driven approach, perhaps it was in its ability to enrich the knowledge of those upcoming musicians. In a sense, it was a real fulfillment of one of the organization's charters: To promote, maintain and advance polka entertainment; and to advance the mutual interest and encourage greater cooperation among its members who are engaged in polka entertainment. To that, I say: "Mission Accomplished."

And there were shots! Seemingly everywhere the camera turned during the three-day event, people were toasting. If there was a drinking game for every time someone on screen took a shot, I'd still be comatose. But it was fun and, given the forced separation to which we have been subjected, it was more than appropriate.

It is hoped that this is the last time something like this will be necessary and exciting to believe that we may soon be experiencing a return to normalcy. But it's nice to know that, should bubonic plague or leprosy ever rear their ugly heads again, we will not be lacking for good polka programming. Kudos to Christy Krawisz and her entire "Plan B" team at the IPA for giving us a fleeting feeling of being together again.

I'd say that deserves a shot!





#### Polka Hall of Famer, Randy Kozlosky's thoughts of the Virtual Festival

Hi Christy and all the IPA team,

Impossible! Well, if someone was to propose 6 months ago what you guys ended up pulling off with the IPA Virtual Festival, I suspected that 99 percent of the people would say that it was impossible. That would be a reasonable answer and there are a millions reasons that would be so.

But, for those who were willing to consider possibilities, dive in, and formulate a plan, let that grown and evolve, work together, draw upon the skills that are available and address a million questions and issues—yes, we all saw what was possible. The effort and collaboration and use the peoples' skills was monumental.

There was so much to love about the virtual festival. I am sincerely glad to have been part of it and to contribute in some ways. Actually, when people see an organization doing great things, it attracts the "do-ers" to be part of the action. You guys have some great momentum in that regard. I hope that continues to snowball.

The variety of quality content was a big key. That kept things interesting and created a mindset of needing to keep tuned in so that I wouldn't miss something. I could go on and on about the positive things. There is a lot of glory to bask in. Enjoy that for a time—sayor it.

If the question now was how to improve things, there could be various tweaks or improvements that could be made to a virtual festival. But, to me, that would be the wrong question. Hopefully this "virtual festival" never has to happen again. But, I'd suggest that the question should be something more like "what now"? Or "how can the sorts of things that we developed be used?" This year's virtual festival showed that many things are possible. It kind of forced everyone to dive into the world of technology that can be used to preserve and promote polkas in a whole new way. There is much that could be said. I'll throw out just a few thoughts/comments.

You can obviously do live-streaming events. I don't need to tell you that. The extent to which you'd choose to do that at festivals or dances is a different question. But, I'd encourage you all to think beyond things like live-streaming events. You can do that too, but there is more to consider. And there is probably a need to keep some level of momentum going (even though everybody probably needs a break)

I loved the interviews. And, as an organization that has preservation as a key component of its mission, there is an opportunity to capture interviews with polka heroes and for those to be made available to the general public. I could see this as a component of a "virtual hall of fame". You guys are probably already thinking of that as well.

On a different note... an amazing number of people watch re-run after re-run of polka shows on t.v. The numbers are so much higher than the number of people who would ever cross the threshold of a polka dance or festival. You have shown that it is possible to create content that would be suitable for a t.v. show or at least something of that format. A show that is actually on broadcast t.v. is several steps (and years) away. But, creating something that can be on-line with that sort of long-term vision would be really cool. The variety that was part of the IPA Virtual Festival is kind of like a good old variety show: live performances, recorded videos, interviews, awards, games, comic relief, competitions, and sharing info about the IPA's efforts. I could see all of these being part of content for such a show.

In the interest of brevity, I'll stop at that. But, I remain up for helping out in whatever ways I can. (Oh, I didn't mention the one thing that I'd like to doshort 5 minute or so interview videos where polka songwriters tell about the back story to their songs.)


