# Hall of Fame member, Adam Barthalt, passes

It's with great sadness that we inform you of the passing of IPA Hall of Fame Inductee Adam Barthalt, who was inducted into the International Polka Association Hall of Fame in 2006.

Adam G. Barthalt died on April 24, 2021 at Peconic Bay Medical Center. He was 85 years old. He was born on June 11, 1935 in Ridgewood, New York to Adam and Susanna (Harnacker) Barthalt. He graduated from Cairo High School. He was the leader of the Adam Barthalt polka band which performed across the U.S. and in Europe, Mexico and Canada. He was awarded the "Golden Badge of Honor" from Austrian National Tourist Office and proclamation of outstanding musical accomplishments from the NY State Assembly Office. He was inducted into the "National Cleveland Style Polka Hall of Fame" and the

"International Polka Association Hall of Fame", along with being elected president of the Kiwanis Club in Ridgewood.

He is survived by his wife of 64 years Margarethe, children Debbie Burke of New Jersey, Adam III of Texas, John of Texas, Suzy Trypuc of Riverhead and Marcie Dilworth of Calverton, 12 grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren and sister Marie Ann Morscher.

Over the years, the IPA® Polka Hall of Fame and Music Awards processes have rightfully recognized deserving polka musicians who attained prominence in the polka industry for their musical achievements that helped promote polka music and broaden its audience. Because of their highly visible roles, bandleaders or "front men and women", usually received most of the recognition for their groups' success that may have contributed to their winning individual awards or their eventual inductions into the Polka Hall of Fame®. Unfortunately, exceptionally talented bandmates who also contributed greatly to the success of their groups, often never received their due recognition.

To address this situation, the IPA® Polka Hall of Fame and Music Awards Committee collaborated with the body of Trustees to establish a new annual award to recognize these deserving "side-men or women" of notable polka bands. To honor the legacy of the longtime Chairman of the IPA® Polka Hall of Fame, Leon Kozicki, the committee and Trustees also recommended the award be titled "The Leon Kozicki Trustees Award". The IPA® Board of Directors approved the establishment of the award effective 2015.

In recent years Don can be heard on recordings with Alex Meixner, LynnMarie, Mike Schneider, David Austin, Tom Brusky, Gary Brueggen, Bud Hyrczyk, Steve Meisner, and many others.

Don has also been involved in radio by hosting polka shows including: Blue Chip Polkas, Polka Funtime and Polka Parade, on a variety of different radio stations. Now with nearly 40 years of radio broadcasting experience, Don is among the longest-running, continuous, polka radio show hosts in the country. His quick wit and upbeat-style shows are currently enjoyed by polka lovers from across the United States and throughout the world.

Although his career has taken him into many different music styles and many different instruments, Don continues today mostly playing woodwinds or bass with multiple different bands both on stage and in the recording studio. He also continues to play a variety of different music styles. He has recorded and is heard on over one-thousand different songs and has hundreds of polka music releases to his credit. it's hard to thumb through a stack of recordings and not find some that Don has either played on, recorded in his studio, or both. Whether on stage, in the studio, or on the radio, Don has no plans to retire anytime soon.

# Frank Napiwocki is one of the recipients this year.


