Let's continue to support polka music in 2022 by attending our **Snow Bird Dances**:



Daughter of the late Polka drummer, Michael Vinecki, competes in the 2022 Olympics - Winter Vinecki

MICHAEL VINECKI of Gaylord was very special to many of us, and we continue to cherish our memories with him. Very sadly, he passed away in 2009 at the young age of 40, having courageously fought a 10-month battle against prostate cancer. Mike was a husband and father of 4. With the passing of his father in 2021, parents Theresa (Slivinski) Vinecki and Virgil have reunited with Mike. I often think about his brother Rick and sister Brenda, their love shared, the heartache felt, and the wonder of Mike's joy if he was here today to give us his wonderful smile while enjoying his growing family and many friends that miss him greatly.

Mike was a musician and spent his teens and early 20's playing polkas across the country. It began at an early age while playing drums with his dad and brother in a 3-piece local band (that's when I met them). Mike played with the Grammy-award band Eddie Blazonczyk's Versatones in 1990 and toured the United States and Europe. He also performed with numerous other bands. While living in the Chicago area in the late-1990's, Mike formed a country band called "Michael Lee and the Dusters" and played in the Illinois area. Auctioneering Northern Michael's second love, and he was an integral part of Vinecki Auction Services with his family. He also obtained his Brokers License in Real Estate.

Following Mike's diagnosis, the family became involved with Athletes for a Cure, a branch of the Prostate Cancer Foundation. "Team Winter" was founded by daughter Winter to actively raise awareness and funds for prostate cancer. Visit www.teamwinter.org

Winter is now 23 years old, having grown up in Gaylord (MI) and Salem (OR), and training in Park City (UT).

After losing her Dad at the age of 9 to an ag-

gressive form of prostate cancer, she formed <u>TeamWinter.org</u>, a 501(c)(3) non-profit to raise money for prostate cancer research and awareness. She has raised over \$500,000 and counting toward that effort.

We join Winter's many supporters and wish her well in her competitions and fund raising. We know there is abundant pride from Heaven.

Michigan connection: Born in Grand Rapids; lives and trains in Gaylord.

Highlights: Ranked No. 2 on World Cup circuit in 2020-21 season, 14th in 2021-22; finished first in women's aerials in a March 2021 World Cup event in Moscow. Finished second in team mixed event and fifth in women's aerials in 2021-22 World Cup event in Ruka, Finland.

The buzz: More of a runner growing up, Vinecki completed her first triathlon at 9, and was the Ironkids National Champion in 2010-11. At 14, she was the youngest person to complete a marathon in Antarctica and at 15, the youngest to complete a marathon on all seven continents. She missed all of the 2021 world championships with a bout of COVID-19.

And, yes, she will be the first Winter Olympian named "Winter."

Mike's little girl is grown and competed in the 2022 Winter Olympic. Unfortunately, she didn't win a medal.

Noodle and Hamburger Casserole Submitted By Carol Trzebiatowski

¼ Ib. Margarine
1 chopped Onion
1 chopped Green Pepper
1 lb. Hamburger
½ package Wide Noodles
1 can Tomato Soup
½ can of Water
Salt and Pepper to taste

Boil noodles in water until cooked, drain and set aside. Sauté onion, green pepper, and hamburger in margarine until meat is fully cooked. Add a dash or two of salt and pepper (to your tastes). When hamburger is brown, add 1 can of tomato soup and ½ can of water. Cook together for about 15 minutes or so. Add drained noodles to the meat mixture and mix well. Put in a 9x13 ungreased casserole dish and bake at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes.

Dissolve one box of strawberry Jell-O 3 ounce size, and one cup of boiling water in a large glass measuring cup. Stir until fully dissolved.

Add 1/4 cup cold water, 1/4 cup of vodka and 1/4 cup banana liqueur and 1/4 cup cream de cacao. Stir well and cool before pouring into Jell-O shot cups

1 package frozen chopped spinach (defrost and remove excess moisture)

1 cup mayonnaise

1 cup sour cream

1 package Knorr Leek recipe mix

1 small can water chestnuts (drained and chopped)

Combine all ingredients and refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving. Use 1 loaf of rye bread. Cut bread into bite size pieces. You can also use bugles, Hawaiian bread or crackers.



Grab Your Balls! IPA goes Bowling

On February 19, 2022, nine of the Illinois International Polka Association Board Members. along with other IPA members, family & friends, attended the 15th annual Candlelight Bowl fundraiser held by the Knights of Columbus New Lenox Council #10926. My dad, Mike Nowakowski, is a Past-Grand Knight of this counsel and, along with my family, has been involved in this effort from its onset. This is a wonderful event loaded with fun and purpose. In 2005, a young brother Knight in my dad's counsel lost his battle with cancer and left his wife and 3 young children behind. The idea for this Candlelight Bowl fundraiser was created by the brother Knights wanting to do something to lend financial support to this family. The "Fallen Knights Fund" was created to do just that. It would guarantee funds would be available annually for clothes, books, etc. until the children turned 18 years old. In 2007, the first Candlelight Bowl was held. Since then, the Knights have raised over \$50,000 and have supported 10 children so far, 3 of which entered the program under the age of 5.

That song went on to be performed and recorded by other top polka bands and was featured in a PBS Special program. He also penned "With This Ring" that was released on a Grammynominated album. After his performing days ended, Dan focused his polka energies on hosting an Internet polka show on the Polka Jammer Network and creating PolkaVision videos that are still seen on YouTube. In addition to his polka endeavors, Dan had a successful career working in the airline and casino industries. Mr. Gury, you accomplished much in your short 70 years.




