
Polka artists interested in possible music (Slovenian, Czech, German, Dutchmen, etc.) awards recognition now have an easy electronic method to get on the ballot! Beginning this year, all working polka artists seeking IPA awards for current year must qo online www.ipapolkas.com/application-musicawards to submit their information. All those who register are eligible for the IPA's Favorite Band and Favorite Vocalist award categories. Recording artists have a special section to upload their musical tracks and graphics to be considered for their additional awards. In all, deserving polka artists are recognized with music awards that include Favorite Album, Favorite Song, Favorite Band, Favorite Male Vocalist, and Favorite Female Vocalist for Polish and International

polka styles. An academy of 195 electors from across the country determines the award winners by casting their votes on annual ballots. The lists of polka artists on these ballots will be generated by the submissions received through the new electronic process. So, you've got to submit every year to win! Complete instructions are available on the website. The deadline to submit for consideration in the next voting cycle is January 14, 2023. Eligible recordings must have been released between January 1 and December 31, 2022. Questions may be directed to MusicAwards@ipapolkas.com.



New Cancellation Policy for IPA Festival in September 2023

The IPA would like to address last minute room cancellations. This past Festival, the IPA had 20 rooms cancelled in the last week. These late and last minute cancellations can affect the profit or loss of the festival. We understand health issues, taking care of aging parents, and other emergencies take precedent over attending a social event. It is the booking 3 or more rooms just in case, only to cancel at the last minute or not show up at all without cancelling that are the ones that really have a negative effect on us as an organization. At this point, the IPA doesn't have a chance to place someone else in that room and it goes back into the general availability of the hotel and can actually count against the IPA room block that we set up for our attendees.

In the contract between the Doubletree and The IPA, we are obligated to fill 85% of our total rooms reserved for the weekend. If we fall below the 85% then the IPA is charged the room rate plus all the taxes for that room. For an example the room rate this year was \$117.00 + 16.38 PA taxes = 133.38. So if the IPA was short 6 room nights it would be \$133.38 x 6= \$800.28. That would be an \$800 loss to the Association. We were fortunate this year that the hotel generously gave us credit for polka fans, which were unable to get into the IPA Block, and paid the higher room rate. This gave us the required nights of rooms booked, so the IPA didn't have to pay extra money to the hotel, it was very close.


The IPA and the Doubletree have detailed waitlists that we can fill these rooms, if we have enough time prior to the festival. Also, if we have time we can use our social media outlets to advertise to the public that if you are staying at another area hotel and would like to be at the Doubletree, we have openings and can get them switched over.

After several discussions between the IPA and The Doubletree, the following will be a new cancellation policy for the 2023 Festival and Convention. We feel this is a good balance for the IPA, the Doubletree and our polka fans.

There will a 21-day prior cancellation for all reservations. If cancelled within the 21 days, they will be charged 1 night of the reservation or NOT get their deposit refunded. The Doubletree will work with us on a one-on-one basis regarding family emergencies, funerals, etc. There will be a 2-room reservations limit.

Thank You for your understanding in this matter.

"When our parents, Chuck and Marge Machay, purchased the Polonia Ballroom, Grove & Lounge in 1964, they found great success in hosting Polka bands from throughout the Chicagoland area. The Polonia name became synonymous with Polka music. Over the years, our parents took down the Grove and renovated the hall into the ballroom as it is known today. The Polonia Banquet hall was a family business from the moment it opened. The hall became a very special place for each of the Machay children, and has continued to be family owned even after Chuck and Marge's passing.

We would like to extend our deepest thanks to our loyal customers who have made Polonia Banquets the amazing success it has been. Without you, our parents' dream of running a successful banquet hall would never have become a reality. A special thank you to John and Zach Mikrut for all of their help prior to November 6th.




































Another Polka Rockin' Weekend..... In Nashville

ish. This year the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust converted a parking lot into a great outdoor concert venue and arts park called The Backyard at 8th and Penn. Throughout the summer there were free performances by over 250 artists who performed with an incredible diversity of musical styles. That included polka music with performances by Mon Valley Push and The KOSMIX.

With the events being free and with the venue being in the middle of Pittsburgh's Cultural District, this created a great opportunity for people to be exposed to many styles of music – including polka music. Unfortunately, being outdoor events, rain and lightning was an issue for the couple of dates I played there. That delayed one performance and lowered the attendance. 

Polish Mushroom Soup (Zupa Grzybowa)

Ingredients:

- 1 lb fresh mushrooms (fresh or frozen porcini, Trumpet Royale, cremini, or button mushrooms)
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 Tbsp unsalted butter
- 2 oz dried porcini mushrooms
- 6 cups hot water
- 4 cups mushroom, beef or chicken stock
- 1 cup sour cream or yogurt
- 3 Tbsp flour
- 4 Tbsp fresh dill, chopped
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Preparation:



Coarsely chop the fresh mushrooms. Heat the butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onions and sauté for 5-7 minutes until softened and translucent. Add the chopped fresh mushrooms and sauté for another 15 minutes.

Add the stock and bring to a low boil. Strain the reconstituted dried mushrooms, reserving the soaking liquid. Rinse the strained mushrooms briefly under cold running water to remove any traces of grit. Carefully decant the strained soaking liquid into the soup, making sure to exclude any remaining grit or debris. Chop the reconstituted mushrooms coarsely and add to the soup.

Cover the pot and reduce the heat to a low simmer and continue to cook for 30 - 45 minutes.

Whisk the flour into sour cream until smooth and lump free. Temper the sour cream/flour mixture by gradually adding about 1 cup of the hot soup to the sour cream, mixing constantly until smooth. Now pour the sour cream mixture slowly into the pot, stirring constantly. Reduce the heat to low and simmer for five minutes, stirring occasionally. Add salt & pepper to taste and stir in 3 tablespoons of the dill.

Serve garnished with the remainder of the chopped dill.
